Throw in red foxes wandering down the street, numerous bald eagles, tundra swans, white foxes and other wildlife too numerous to mention and you have the focus of Tom Polk's 33-Day Bucket List Trip.

Another highlight was the "Tundra Rovers" that went right through all the shallow tundra lakes, so fun! The local tour guides were quite a wealth of information, which added tremendously to the experience.





















Believe it or not, the trip on the way to Churchill and returning to its endpoint in Rapid City, South Dakota was just as spectacular, memorable and exciting as the beluga whales and polar bears!
