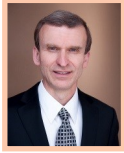

## President's Message

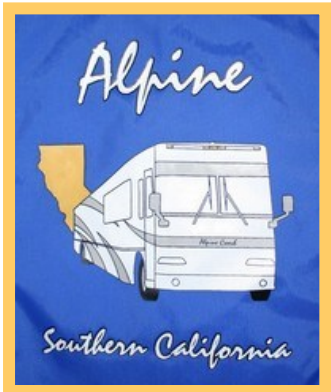

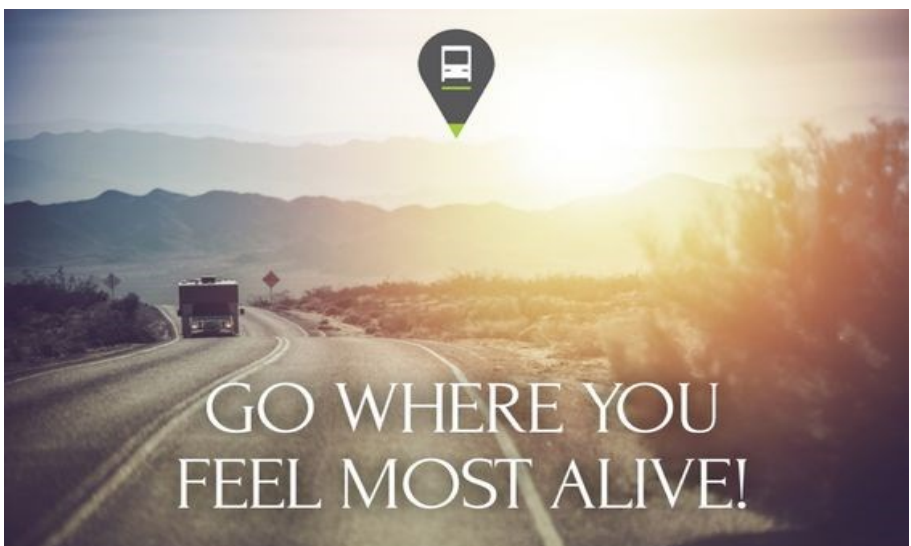

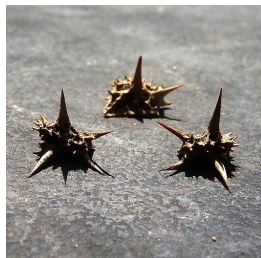
